

Lunchtime / After School Christian Clubs in Primary Schools

We are hearing of an increasing number of extra-curricular Christian clubs starting in schools in the diocese. Some are run by school staff, others by visitors from the local Christian community. They have a variety of names such as, Prayer Club, Faith Club, Big Questions Club.

These clubs are different to a church group such as a Sunday Club, or Messy Church because of the school setting. While they are explicitly Christian the children participating may come from homes of other faiths and beliefs, or none, so the material should be less confessional than in a church group.

These clubs are different to school collective worship or RE lessons because the children have chosen to be there, and they are run outside the formal curriculum time. The content may include songs, prayers and activities that are more confessional than is appropriate in collective worship.

We recommend these guiding principles

The school safeguarding requirements and procedures must be followed.

Parents should be made aware of the Christian nature of the content.

Parents should give written permission for their child to attend such a club.

The school leadership should be aware of the content.

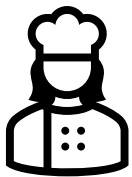
Children should be *invited* to join in with activities such as prayers and singing and given the option to observe if they wish.

Leaders should avoid the language of 'we believe and use the language 'Christians believe 'I am a Christian and I believe'.

Below are a few suggestions for the content of these extra-curricular clubs.

Please note that we have not read every session in the resources below, leaders must use their knowledge of their children to decide what is appropriate for their school club.

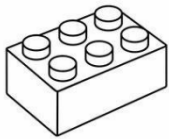

Lego (or Brick) Church Be aware that Lego are protective of their tradename name being used, so we advise using the words 'Brick' or 'Block' in the name of your club.



Use a video or images made of Lego to tell the Bible story. Then build scenes to create the story. You could then do your own stop-go animation of the story to share with others.
