Instructions for making the 'To boldly go....' passport

Each class will need to make a passport, which will become the reflective 'journal for this term', containing the reflection sheets for each week.

Bind it into a single A4 sized passport using a folder or presentation book (with plastic insert pages). You might want to add your school badge to the front of the 'passport'.

Print out the class page, one per class, for your reflection areas in week 2. Leave pens out so that children can write their own names to their class page – ask adults to sign as well.

You will then add the other pages week by week, which are also included in the script for each week's collective worship.

Take a Penny Farthing card from the reflective area



Think about something that you are finding difficult at the moment.

This could be something at school or something outside of school.



Write or draw this onto the card. Keep this card somewhere safe to remind you to keep on going in the coming weeks.



Talk about how Thomas Stevens 'kept on keeping on' in his big Penny Farthing adventure.

How might his adventures inspire you to 'keep on keeping on'?



....encourage one another and build each other up....

(1 Thessalonians 5:11)

In her lifetime, Amelia Earhart encouraged many other women to reach for their dreams. Her story has been an encouragement for many others since who want to make a difference in the world.

Take a blank card from the reflective area



Talk together about the things you find encouraging about Amelia Earhart's life and her example. How did she encourage others?



Think about someone who might need encouraging this week. This could be someone in school, or someone at home.



Write them a card with some helpful, encouraging words. Don't forget to give it to them!



Jesus said that his words can be trusted, like building on a firm foundation.

(Matthew 7: 24-27)

Take a blank card from the reflective area



Talk together about the things that you trust in life.




Choose the most important one for you.

Hold the bottle in your hands and think of a very special journey that you have been on.




How was that journey a blessing for you – and maybe for others too?

Talk together about your journeys, or bring in some mementoes of your time to show to each other during this week.



Jesus said that because of the present of his presence, he would be with his friends 'always and forever'.

Take a label from the box.



Think about someone who might need to know they are not alone, or who needs God's help. It might be you!



Write or draw this onto the label.
You might want to hold the label in your hand and pray for them.



Put the label into the box when you have finished.



When Paul met Jesus on the road to Damascus, his life was changed forever. He learned how to see his life and other people in God's way.



Put on the different glasses and think about how they change how you see things.



Are there people or situations you might need to 'see' differently?



Talk about how this might change our school for the better.

If you'd like to, bring these things before God and ask Him to help you to see things as He does.



Paul wrote: 'Run the race with perseverance. Keep on going and don't give up!'



Paul's life was full of adventure and danger, but he trusted God.

Talk together about where you saw this in the story.



Do you sometimes feel like giving up? Are there things you feel are really hard to do?



Write a message or a prayer on a strip of map, then post it into the bottle. As you do, ask God to help you, if you'd like to.



In the story of Duni Chand, and the words of Jesus, we have been thinking about treasure that will truly last.



Pick up some 'treasure' and hold it in your hand while you think.



What do you truly treasure?


Think about the message in the story or the words of Jesus.

Think about someone who has shared their wisdom with you this year.




How has their wisdom helped you?
